


## LifeMsg User Manual




## **View Messages**

LifeMsg is used to display important information about the connected device including software levels, alteration dates and any calibration errors.



Connect to and disconnect from a specific device with <u>Device</u>, <u>Connect</u> and <u>Device</u>, <u>Disconnect</u>. Select <u>Device</u>, <u>AutoConnect</u> to begin searching and connect to the first available device. Access auto connect options under <u>Options</u>, <u>AutoConnect</u>.



Activate <u>Auto connect at startup</u> to connect to the first available device when the programme is initialised.


Activate <u>Single shot</u> to stop searching for a device once connection is lost. A new connection must be manually initiated.

With auto offline deactivated, the programme will try to re-establish lost connections with the same device only. Activate *auto Offline* to revert to offline status when a connection is lost. If single shot is disabled, the program will go back into auto read mode and connect to the next available device.

Any errors will be indicated with a flashing red device menu. Select <u>Device</u>, <u>Errors</u> to view the list. Errors will be shown in red and described below the failed item. A number will display how many times the error has occurred. Warnings are displayed in yellow and can be cleared with the <u>Clear</u> button. Use the 'Show' buttons to change what items are visible. Use <u>Refresh</u> to recheck error status and <u>Dismiss</u> to close.



Store the message screen contents with  $\underline{File}$ ,  $\underline{Save}$ . This will create a text file with the chosen name in the working directory.
